The Town Council meets every month and our aim is to represent the local community in a fair, balanced and informed manner to improve the quality of life for all in Yarm.

There are 11 sitting Councillors who are responsible for delivering a range of services and events for the town's people.

WHAT WILL I DO ?

- As a Town Councillor you will be part of making decisions about (e.g.): Yarm Cemeteries and Chapel, Yarm Allotments, Events, Floral Displays, Street Benches, Play Areas (Willey Flatts & Snaith's Field), Our Venues (The Town Hall - soon to include a Heritage Centre, Morley Carr Bowling Facility - coming soon, Fellowship Hall and The Rookery).
- Work to identify issues which are important to the lives of our residents (including quality of life & our local environment).
- Aim to influence and shape long term development policy for Yarm, including commenting on planning applications.

WHAT DO I NEED IN ORDER TO STAND ?

You must be: - Over 18 years old; - Be a British Citizen or an eligible Commonwealth Citizen.

And at least one of the following 4 options: - registered as a local government elector for Yarm; - occupy as owner or tenant land or other premises in Yarm for the past 12 months; - work in the Parish as your principal or only place of work or live within a 3 mile radius.

ANYTHING ELSE ?

It would help if you are: able to attend meetings and events; want to help our local community; keen to improve Yarm and its environment; willing to represent the views of all and work as part of a team.
